BEING THE RIGHT FRIEND WITH GOD

Friendship with God requires Submission

Submission is the action of repentance with a humble spirit.

God responds to our submission with grace through forgiveness.

SUBMITTING THE RIGHT WAY

Resisting and Returning

Resistance against the devil is possible because the <u>Cross crippled</u> his power.

Our opposition grows stronger as God gets closer.

Purifying and Maintaining

Reluctance to repent of our actions leads to opposition from God.

Constant repentance fills our life with clarity and stability.

Disgust and Contentment

Tolerating sin leads to mediocre standards and a less meaningful life.

Lives marked by pride continually try to create their contentment.

Lives marked by <u>humility</u> continually <u>receive</u> God's <u>promises</u> as their <u>contentment</u>.

4. Read Luke 18:9-14 Give an example when you were temped to be like the Pharisee and exalted yourself at another other person or God's expense?

5. Read Philippians 2:4-5 – Paul describes a balance between thinking of others and thinking of you. What do you believe is a Christ-like balance between the thinking and caring for others and yourself?

6. Philippians 2:6-8 - Christ knew equality to God was not an option but because of sin we do. How do we attempt to gain equality with God?

7. Read Philippians 4:11-13 - Even though verse 13 is the biggest "Christian cliché" of our day and age and is horrifically taken out of context. How is Paul using verse 13 to reinforce his contentment? How is God teaching you to be content in all things?

8. Read 1 Peter 5:6. What does it mean to you to be exalted by God?
