A BETTER AGREEMENT

The New Covenant (agreement) is definitely not the past, but it's also not quite the future.

New through relationship. Internal vs. external Exodus 24:12; 34:1; Galatians 4:6

New through <u>fellowship</u>. Devotion vs. animosity Exodus 24:12; 34:1; Galatians 4:6

New through intimacy. Closeness vs. distance Exodus 3:13; Leviticus 16:2; Exodus 19:23-24; Hebrews 10:19-20

New through forgiveness. Free vs. bound

A DIFFERENT AGREEMENT - DIFFERENT IN KIND

The old covenant suffered from planned obsolescence.

It was never meant to be permanent.

Just like the law, we can become obsolete through

- Legalistic judgments
- Generational prejudice (young or old)
- Loss of purpose and priority

Ephesians 4:22 suggests that even as new creatures, we may be tempted to live in obsolescence instead of new life. Where are you living today?
