Our choice: refuse or receive - follow or don't

Small Group Homework - Week of May 29, 2016

On Sunday we heard about a pretty incredible celebration that will go on some day in God's presence, and in a sense is going on in our heart right now. Yet we also saw that even though we're on the road to Zion, we still need to be careful not to refuse God's voice. 2. Read back over Hebrews 12:22-24. Why do those verses give more weight to the warning not to refuse God who speaks to us (in verse 25)?
