### WHY COMMUNION? 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

The Lord's Supper is not about what we can do for God; it is about what God has done for us. It is a special reminder of the unique relationship we have with God and the special union we have with one another.

#### Communion or disunion – a crisis in character

My favoritism can turn worship into a harmful situation

I show contempt for God's church in my selectivity of individuals

# God's communiqué or our agenda

Remembering Jesus with the wafer says we all share the same roots.

Remembering Jesus with the cup says we all share the same relationship.

Regular participation in the Lord's Supper says nothing is more important to us than <u>lesus's death</u>.

#### God's good or our bad?

Messing up communion is like painting <u>a moustache on the Mona Lisa</u>. (Exodus 17:6 with Numbers 20:11)

- We deface the picture of Christ's death
- We deface the picture of Christ's church

God's delay does not mean that he doesn't take it seriously.

Unworthy means unthinking

Unworthy means uncaring

Unworthy means unrepentant

It's time for communion. As we approach it today, make a special effort to focus on Christ and his church – on the blessings that you have because of what he has done for you. Remember him!

# Small Group Homework - Week of June 6, 2016
