

## UNLIKELY PEOPLE IN UNLIKELY CHURCHES 1 Timothy 1:12–17

It's not the healthy that need a doctor; it is the sick. I have not come to call the righteous but the sinners to repentance.

The unlikely messenger

God will often use those whom we would reject

We reject people

- because of their past
- because of their faults
- because of their personality
- because of their failure

Unlikely churches - Paul was not the end-point of God's grace

Churches are not perfect places filled with perfect people

God's uses Paul to demonstrate his transforming grace in Paul's life

If God can <u>forgive</u> the worst of sinners, he can <u>forgive</u> anyone

If God can <u>save</u> Paul, he can <u>save</u> anyone

If God can <u>transform</u> Paul, he can <u>transform</u> anyone

## Taking it home

Even though Paul was forgiven he never forgot his past; it made the realization of God's grace even greater. Read 1 Timothy 1:15 and Ezekiel 33:10-12. Consider God's grace to you in your life and take some time meditating on Paul's response to God's grace in his life (1 Timothy 1:17).

God accepted Paul (and us) because Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners (1 Tim 1:15; Ezekiel 3:11-12)
