It's the Spirit that makes the difference (Galatians 5:13-23; Jeremiah 17:5-8)

Walking in the Spirit – we don't let personal fear, desires, advantage or pride override our commitment to God.

Being led by the Spirit, not the law – we respond to the Spirit's promptings with a desire to do as he directs.

Keeping in step with the Spirit – We consistently follow building positive, reflexive spiritual habits.

Whether we are walking in the Spirit or in the flesh can be summed up in three words: trust, confidence and strength.

Transformational living comes by the Spirit (2 Corinthians 3:12-18)

The Story (Exodus 34:29-35)

Seeing God's glory was not meant to bring fear, it was meant to bring life.

Walking in the flesh <u>clouds our view of God</u> and <u>distorts the view that</u> <u>others have of God through us</u>.

When we walk in the Spirit the veil finally comes off.

We can see who he really is.

We can be transformed into his image.

We can experience his glory as we grow in him.

We can as transformed people transform others in a new way of life.
