Taking it With You

6. Christ's followers were in disbelief and bewilderment following the crucifixion and even after the resurrection. It is safe to say you will find yourself in similar predicaments in the future despite already knowing the truth. What pattern can you be setting now to help maintain hope in trials, suffering, and uncertainty?

Luke 24:28-35 Hope is manifested in our intimacy with Jesus Christ.
