### The road to failure (John 18:15-18, 25-27)

We are most vulnerable when we think we are most invulnerable (1 Corinthians 10:11-12)

Two men, two different paths

The difference between Peter and Judas where there was a heart for Jesus in Peter, there was only a heart for Judas in Judas.

### From ruin to restoration (John 21:15-23, 25-27)

Peter wasn't ready to move forward until he revisited his failure.

He had to go through five crucial steps from ruin to restoration:

Ruin, Recognition, Repentance, Reconciliation, and Restoration

But many Christians want repentance without restoration.

### Restoration in us and through us (Galatians 6:1)
