What Changes Everything Galatians 4:1-7

From burdensome, enslaved adolescence (Galatians 4:1-3)

Two functions of law:

The moral control of the pedagogue

The legal control of the guardian & trustee

The elemental forces that conspire to condemn

Because God sent his Son (Galatians 4:4-5)

The right time (the fullness of time)

The right person (his Son)

The right pedigree (born of a woman)

The right **condition** (born under the law)

Jesus didn't come under grace, <u>but under law</u>, so that those who were under law, <u>might be received under grace</u>.

The right <u>purpose</u> (to redeem those under the law)

To joyous adulthood as full heirs (Galatians 4:6-7)

A new relationship (adoption to "sonship")

A new resource (the Spirit of God – intimately related to Him)

A new realization (it's personal for all of us as individuals)
