2. James says that we show that we have faith by what we do. Read Genesis 3:1-7. Satan makes three accusations against the character of God. How does the action of Adam and Eve in eating the fruit show their lack of faith in God's character?

3. Read Hebrews 11:1-6. Verse 1 is sometimes called a definition of faith, but it is really a description. Abel is commended for his faith that was demonstrated by bringing an acceptable sacrifice. Now, go to the original story in Genesis 4:2-24. Abel's acceptable sacrifice is described in one verse (4) while the rest of the chapter is about Cain's unacceptable sacrifice. Write down your thoughts about how Cain's actions (and those of his descendants) show an increasing lack of faith in God.
