1. Which of your five senses would you say is the strongest?

Into the Bible

2. John 7-9 is a continuous narrative—all the events are related to the Feast of the Tabernacles. We know from Jewish sources from the time of Christ that on the last day of the feast, the priests took a pitcher of water from the Pool of Siloam back to the temple to be poured out. Read John 7:37-39. John connects the sign of the water with the Holy Spirit. Think about what it meant for Jesus to send the blind man from the temple to the Pool of Siloam to wash in the water so his blindness would be healed.

3. The blind man wouldn't have had any formal education, yet his responses to the questions of the Pharisees confounded them, just as Jesus's answers did. Read Acts 4:13-14. What insight do we get from the response of the Sanhedrin to Peter and John?
