Some Things to Think About

Why we should be thankful

- God is thanked for his deliverance (Ps 35:18),
- for loving us and being faithful (Ps 52:9; 107:8),
- for hearing our cry (Ps 118:21),
- for safe arrival after a long, arduous journey (Acts 28:15),
- for other believers and for the testimony of their faith (Rom 1:8).
- for the gift of salvation that enables one not to sin (Rom 6:17),
- for delivering us from our tendency to sin (Rom 7:25),
- for the spiritual gift of being able to address God (1 Cor 14:18),
- for resurrection hope (1 Cor 15:57),
- for testimony, deliverance and victory in the midst of persecution (2 Cor 2:14),
- for the support of a colleague in ministry (2 Cor 8:16),
- for other believers (Phil 1:3; Col 1:3; 2 Tim 1:3; Philem 4),
- for those who respond to God's Word (1 Thess 2:13),
- for being able to serve others for God (1 Tim 1:12)
- and for his attributes (Rev 4:9).

Notice that this list includes not one item having to do with things, with possessions.¹
