1. What is your favorite seasoning—either a particular spice or an herb?

Into the Bible

2. In Matthew 5:12 Jesus tells his disciples, "You are the light of the world", but in John 8:12 Jesus says, "/am the light of the world." How do we resolve the apparent paradox of these two statements? Read Ephesians 5:8-16. What does this passage say about how we become light in the world? Why does Paul say that we are put into the world as light? How should this make us act all the time, but especially in unsettled times like we are facing now?

Application

3. Darkness does not exist independently of light; it is merely the <u>absence</u> of light. If we are to dispel the darkness around us, we must shine our light into it. Read John 1:4-5. How does this truth give us confidence in shining light into darkness? What specific ways can I make my light visible to those in darkness this week?
