Small Group Questions

Getting to Know You:

1. What is the most memorable road sign you have seen?

Into the Bible:

2. The Pharisees in this passage were not really asking for a sign, they were challenging Jesus to prove himself. This is actually willful disbelief. In Andrew Lloyd Weber's rock opera "Jesus Christ, Superstar", Herod mockingly challenges Jesus in similar fashion.

So, you are the Christ, you're the great Jesus Christ.

Prove to me that you're no fool; walk across my swimming pool. What is Christ's response to a similar challenge from Satan himself in Matthew 4:7?

3. In verse 42 Jesus tells his listeners that wisdom greater than Solomon's is among them. John, in chapter 1 of his gospel identifies Christ as the "logos" meaning Jesus himself was that wisdom. Compare John 1:1-5 with Paul's testimony in I Corinthians 1:24 and Colossians 2:9. How is Christ's wisdom greater than Solomon's?

Application:

4. In verses 43-45 Jesus calls out the "evil generation" he was ministering to. Both individually and as a nation the symptoms of the Fall were being put right by Christ (Matthew 4:23-25, 15:29-31) Although the people welcomed his miracles of healing, they missed the bigger need which was healing of the heart. Which of these was Jesus healing in the following situations: Matthew 9:1-8, Luke 8:26-40, Luke 17:11-19? How often do we pray for healing of physical or situational needs while missing our need for "heart" healing?

For Families:

5. Talk with your children about the times you have sought wisdom from God.
