Getting to Know You:

1. What is the most distinctive feature you would identify as a recognizable family resemblance in your family?

2. We enter into our earthly family at birth. What is the parallel to this in our spiritual life? (John 1:12-13, John 3:1-5; Ephesians 1:5)

3. Given the importance of family in Middle Eastern cultures, Jesus' emphasis here in redefining his family must have shocked his listeners. Seemingly though, he doubles down on this distinction in Matthew 10:37 and Luke 14:25-26. Jesus did care for his earthly family, so what is his emphasis in these passages? How does this apply to us and our family relationships?
