Small Group Study Questions

Application:

1) In Matthew 24:6-7, Jesus tells his disciples that there will continue to be things like wars, famines, and natural disasters until the time of his coming. But he also tells them not to be afraid or alarmed. How can followers of Christ live in a world full of many kinds of trouble without fear? What do we know about God that prevents fear? What do we know about his promises? What areas of your life are you more prone to respond in fear rather than faith?

2) The disciples were told that instead of immediately receiving the kingdom and all of the promises associated with it, that there would be a delay. And their wait would come with persecution, trouble, and death. While this would certainly have been difficult to hear, it was not the first time. How does this warning overlap with what Jesus said in Matthew 10? As followers of Christ, how do we find comfort and encouragement during persecution? Does the world around us even see enough of Christ in our lives to know that we are different?

3) The nation of Israel had rejected her messiah and the judgment that was coming was going to be severe. But the disciples are going to suffer persecution not because they are disobedient, but because they are faithful. It's tempting to think that God "owes" me something for my obedience. What DOES God promise us when we obey? It can be difficult to continue in obedience when circumstances are hard. Are there areas of your life where you are growing "weary of doing good?" How can the group be praying specifically for strength and encouragement?

4) This section reminds the disciples and us that the kingdom is something that we still wait for. But the time is not wasted. While the kingdom is delayed, the gospel goes out to the whole world. We know that we take part in that gospel promise and proclamation. How do we know that the gospel will not be preached in vain? How should that motivate and encourage us? Who are you specifically praying for the opportunity to share the gospel with?

5) Talk with your kids about the hope that we have in a world that in is in turmoil and maybe even frightening at times. Remind them of the hope that we have in knowing that God has a plan, and that our home is ultimately in heaven and not in the brokenness of a sinful world.
