1. Well before Zechariah, Isaiah prophesied of one who would arise as Israel's Messiah. (Isaiah 11:1 & 11, Isaiah 53:2) How do these verses connect to Christ and his coming?

Application

 Zechariah sees Joshua, the high priest, having his filthy garments removed and given clean, new robes as a symbol of sins removed and righteousness given instead. We have much to be thankful for since Christ has done this for us and continues to do this. (Psalm 103:12, 1 John 1:9, Isaiah 61:10) 3. In Revelation 7:9-11, John records a vision of a multitude of people from every tongue and tribe around the world standing in worship around the throne of Christ.
